MODERNIZATION DONE!

FINALLY, the women's restroom off the Nursery has been completed. Hallelujah!

The Nebraska Presbyterian Foundation graciously provided the grant funds to construct an **enclosure** over the existing outside steps, new metal double doors, lighting, a lift, a heater to keep temperatures above freezing (a lift requirement) and a new wider door at the bottom of the steps. In the restroom, the two stools and wood walls were removed with a single new stool, a new sink and counter installed. New lighting, a vent fan, and a new lever door knob and lock were installed. Also, railings and grab bars were installed. These many changes make the basement and restroom handicap accessible.

Those who have some difficulty with steps can use the lift which has call controllers (both at the top and bottom of the steps) to access the Westminster Hall activities.

DIAPER CLOSET

The number of families using the Diaper Closet is definitely on the rise. If you are at the church on a Monday between 4 and 6 pm, stop in to visit with the families. If you would enjoy volunteering, we will soon do the "big clothes swap" and many hands will be needed. We box up the winter clothes and put out the summer clothes. We also need volunteers to staff the Diaper Closet. When a month has five Mondays, getting staff for the third Monday is especially tough. Donations are always needed. We never seem to have enough boys' clothes in sizes 4T and 5T. We have a huge amount of cute tiny infant outfits and very little for bigger toddlers. For diapers, we have a large amount of sizes Newborn to 3, and not enough sizes 4 to 7.

EASTER SERMON SERIES

As we step into the season of Easter, a period marked by resurrection and renewal, our journey is themed around three profound pillars: Belong, Behave, Believe. Second Sunday of Easter: Believe--On the Second Sunday, we delve deeper into the heart of our journey: belief. Our belief in the resurrection is not just an acknowledgement of an event but a living, breathing commitment. It's in this belief that we find the strength to face our trials, the courage to stand for justice, and the hope to see beyond our current circumstances. This Sunday calls us to reaffirm our belief, not as a passive state of mind, but as an active engagement with our faith.
